Seeking nominations for **Chamber Person of the Year** Plans are underway for the 112th Annual meeting of the Marshalltown Area Chamber of Com-

merce. The event will be held in June, with more details to follow.

Each year at the Annual meeting, two awards are presented to Chamber members: Chairman's Community Impact Award and Chamber Person of the Year. In 2008, Emerson Process Management - Fisher Division was awarded the Chairman's Community Impact Award. In 2009, it went to Marshalltown Medical Surgical Center. The Chairman's Community Impact Award is given to a business or organization that has made a significant impact on the landscape of Marshalltown.

Kristen Monroe, Ultimate Web Design was the first winner of the Chamber Person of the Year award in 2008. At last year's event, Michelle Spohnheimer, City of Marshalltown, was designated the Chamber Person of the Year. The Chamber Person of the Year award recognizes an outstanding volutneer who has demonstrated a dedication to the Chamber's mission and program of work.

The selection committee will choose the receipients of the two awards. Decision of the selection committee is final.

"We enjoy using Elmwood for the Chamber Ambassadors golf outing each year," said Gary Schaudt, Ambassadors golf outing chair. "Dennis [Buffington], Jerry and the entire staff at Elmwood and the pro shop are great partners on the event. Elmwood is a great asset to the community."

Employing 25 - 50 people, depending on the season, Elmwood is an amenity many local businesses use in recruiting employees to Marshalltown.

"We are fortunate to have major corporations that bring a diverse group of associates that soon learn the benefits of Marshalltown, such as 10 minute work commutes," said Dennis Buffington, Elmwood General Manager. "The best part about being in Marshalltown is the people."

To celebrate their 90th anniversary, Elmwood is hosting a Prospective Member Week and Open House May 2 - 8. Festivities for the week include a 4-person "Shambles" tournament, Ladies Best Shot outing, couples "Twilight" golf event, golf and tennis clinics, and reduced green fees for prospective members throughout the week. Their 90th Anniversary Open House will be held Sunday, May 2 from Noon to 4:00 p.m.

When asked why Elmwood supports the Chamber and is a long-time member, Buffington replied, "The Chamber looks out for the long-term good of the community and is a major resource for any type of business, either already located here or thinking of locating here."

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

How important is manufacturing in Iowa?

As U.S., and in particular Iowa, manufacturers struggle to recover from the recession, it is important to understand just how important a role manufacturing plays in our economy. According to a report released by the National Association of Manufacturers and the Council of Manufacturing Associations, "Manufacturing generates more economic activity per dollar of production than any other business sector in the country. Manufacturing industries perform almost two-thirds of the private sector research and development, driving America's leading edge innovation and breakthrough technologies."

Here are a few facts about manufacturing in Iowa:

- Manufacturing generates approximately 21% of Iowa's Gross Domestic Product (GDP), placing Iowa 2nd among the states in percentage of total GDP from manufacturing.
- 95% of Iowa's manufacturing firms are owned by small to medium-sized enterprises with fewer than 500 employees.
- Iowa's manufacturing employment accounts for nearly 12% of the state's total employment.
- Iowa is home to approximately 6,000 manufacturing firms.
- -Iowa exports approximately \$8 billion worth of manufactured goods.
- In Marshall County, manufacturing accounts for over 5,000 jobs. America's capacity to generate wealth and long-term economic growth and jobs depend upon the ability of manufacturing to prosper. So, when manufacturing prospers, jobs are created, innovation occurs and our long-term economy prospers.

2010 Legislative Session Review

Here is a summary of our legislative priorities and what happened with them during the 2010 Legislative session.

STATE FINANCES

We stated that "it is critical that the State of Iowa continue to balance the state budget each year. Our ability to grow the economy of Iowa demands that our State leaders aggressively address this budget dilemma and return this State to sound government financial and regulatory policies."

A modest state reorganization bill was passed, but the debate continues as to how much this will actually save. Based on our priority statement, we believe that the Legislature continues to use one-time money, and is not fundamentally addressing the budget dilemma.

ECONOMIC GROWTH

We stated that we support Right-to-Work, and oppose employee choice of doctor, prevailing wage, and open-scope bargaining,

No action was taken on any of these anti-business issues.

We also opposed additional health insurance mandates.

A mandate for broad mental and substance abuse insurance coverage to employees that are veterans was approved. This bill also requires a public

PROPERTY TAX

We called for a complete reform of the property tax system, because there is a continuing shift of the property tax burden to commercial and industrial property.

No action was taken on property tax reform.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP

We stated support for the Research Activities Tax Credit.

The Research Activities Tax Credit was extended in a modified form that diminishes its effectiveness for our larger employers.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

We stated support for establishing 21st Century learning skills by setting statewide, out-come based standards, implementing the Iowa Core Curriculum, considering the lengthening of the school day or school year, intensifying the education and business relationship and supporting continuation of job training incentives.

The Legislature adopted Race to the Top legislation. While we supported most of the concepts outlined in this legislation, we weren't able to support it because of the addition of the idea that solutions to address low-achieving schools had to be negotiated with teachers.

TRANSPORTATION

We stated that we recognize the need for more resources to address the needs of our highway infrastructure and would support a reasonable gas tax increase.

No action was taken on increasing infrastructure funding. The Governor proposed a \$50 million diversion of road use tax money as a way to fund State Patrol operations. We opposed this idea and the Legislature did not accept this diversion proposal in the budget that was adopted.
